

PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

CLASS 2 - MOVING ROBOTS

This half term, children in Class 2 have been exploring coding and programming, learning how to give clear instructions to control a robot. They have discovered how commands tell a robot what to do and the importance of direction when moving. The children have learned the difference between forwards and backwards movement and how these commands affect the robot's motion.







Through handson activities, children explored different ways a robot can move and predicted what a program will do before running it.

This has helped children to explore their emotions, build selfawareness, and develop strategies for personal growth. Tracey also led a whole-school assembly, encouraging everyone to reflect on their mental well-being and the importance of understanding themselves to achieve personal growth. Our ongoing work to support mental well-being will empower our pupils with tools to support their emotional resilience.



VILLAGE PEN PALS

We are delighted to share that our pupils have begun a heart-warming Pen Pal Scheme, writing letters to elderly residents in the village. This initiative aims to strengthen community ties, foster meaningful friendships, and provide children with the opportunity to connect with different generations. Through their letters, the children are not only developing their writing skills but also bringing joy and companionship to residents who truly appreciate the interaction.

RAIL SAFETY

To help children understand the dangers of rail travel, our school recently joined a rail safety webinar led by industry experts. The session focused on the importance of staying safe near train tracks, highlighting key risks such as trespassing, level crossings, and platform awareness. Through engaging discussions, videos, and real-life scenarios, children learned about the speed and power of trains, the dangers of distractions, and the importance of using designated crossings. They were also encouraged to always follow safety rules when traveling by train. This vital session aimed to equip children with the knowledge to stay safe and make responsible choices around railways.

Qualified instructors will lead the sessions, supported by Mrs Henry. Ms Hosie will supervise children who are not taking part, ensuring they engage in age-appropriate activities.

EARLY YEARS - FAMILY READ

This additional provision is fully funded by the school to enrich our music curriculum and provide valuable learning experiences.
